A number of years ago a well-known researcher participated in one of our tours. In obvious ways it was conveyed that I was appreciated simply as a generalized guide routing, lodging, meals, etc. Fast-forwarding to this spring in Latin America where I experience a parallel situation, except this time roles are reversed – I am the one that affords little deference to the local guide. I chastise myself upon awareness of being too much akin to the source of my unease more than a dozen years before, yet am unwilling to affect a more considerable change. Passion compels urgency, 'Content with the act of personal discovery I manifest traits of a fringe-birder, often missing time and sightings with the others'. Can it be that one who has guided for thousands of clients on hundred of tours, is himself an entirely dreadful tour participant? I believe one truth lies in motivation – a personal truth, unique to the individual. I am 'a hunter', pure and simple... I am not really 'a lister' (though I do tally totals), nor am I that joyful soul who brims with pleasure in 'the seeing of birds'. Rather when afield my narrow focus, the essence of birding, is 'the chase' - a trait, thankfully, best suited for a bird guide. If confession is indeed good for the soul then the problematic behavior of this tour participant will bear fruit in a greater awareness of the motive(s) that actuate each individual birdwatcher.
